# **Veterans Day Facts**

Veterans Day originated as "Armistice Day" on Nov. 11, 1919, the first anniversary of the end of World War I. Congress passed a resolution in 1926 for an annual observance, and Nov. 11 became a national holiday beginning in 1938. Unlike Memorial Day, Veterans Day pays tribute to all American veterans—living or dead—but especially gives thanks to living veterans who served their country honorably during war or peacetime.

### When Is Veterans Day?

- Veterans Day occurs on November 11 every year in the United States in honor of the "eleventh hour of the eleventh day of the eleventh month" of 1918 that signaled the end of World War I, known as Armistice Day.
- In 1954, President <u>Dwight D. Eisenhower</u> officially changed the name of the holiday from Armistice Day to <u>Veterans Day</u>.
- In 1968, the Uniform Holidays Bill was passed by Congress, which moved the celebration of Veterans Day to the fourth Monday in October. The law went into effect in 1971, but in 1975 President <u>Gerald</u> <u>Ford</u> returned Veterans Day to November 11, due to the important historical significance of the date.

- Veterans Day commemorates veterans of all wars.
- Great Britain, France, Australia and Canada also commemorate the veterans of <u>World War I</u> and <u>World War II</u> on or near November 11th: Canada has Remembrance Day, while Britain has Remembrance Sunday (the second Sunday of November).
- In Europe, Great Britain and the Commonwealth countries it is common to observe two minutes of silence at 11 a.m. every November 11.
- Every Veterans Day and Memorial Day, Arlington National Cemetery holds an annual memorial service. The cemetery is home to the graves of over 400,000 people, most of whom served in the military.

#### Letter from Bonnie

Dear friends,

Well, it's Thursday which means it's time for another letter to the conference from the conference minister. Sometimes I wonder if you appreciate, are interested, ignore these writings, or maybe just wish I'd take a break. Yet, for me this is a moment for sharing thoughts, hopes, faith, dreams, musings, challenges, and the curiosities of life. How do you do that?

I recently had a conversation with some peers, other conference ministers in my community of practice, about leadership. Curiously we are all, the six of us, different leaders – some more collaborative, some vision setting, some consensus builders, some more adept at the changing environment, some more directive and collaborative – depending on the situation. I will let you determine for yourself where I fall in this leadership spectrum.

To a person, we all hoped we were demonstrating care in our leadership styles and actions. To a person, we all relied on our faith to guide us. To a person, we all appreciated the differences in leadership styles of members of the group and members of our conferences. I want you to know that I believe we have some of the strongest and best leaders in the United Church of Christ within our conference. Sometimes individuals are reluctant to step forward and share their skills. Sometimes people over-function. Sometimes people hide their skills and talents under a bushel basket. Many of you will remember what Jesus said about no one hiding their light under a bushel basket.

So, I want you to know that we, in the conference, want you to shine. We want you to share opinions, ideas, skills, and talents. We want you to be generous in your congregations and in the conference. We depend on you. It takes all of us inside congregations and inside the conference to become all we can be. Each of us, with our different gifts, skills, and talents, are essential to positive accomplishment of our mission to change lives by equipping, empowering, and supporting those who would spread Christ's ministry. Spend some time thinking about the gifts you might be able to share – in your congregation and in the conference.

And, by the way, leadership is expressed in many ways, and leaders express many viewpoints. The conference, the congregation, the whole of the UCC is a big tent where ideas, offered with respect, are welcome; where the different viewpoints, we have, need to be shared and nurtured so we can see all parts of goals, issues, and our community's needs and gifts. Where am I going with this? You knew there was an ask coming, right? I am your conference minister after all. The Conference Nominating Committee will soon begin its work. You may receive a call asking you to serve – it may be in a familiar and comfortable way, or it may be in a way that stretches you. Please prayerfully consider how you can and will serve. All of us together make the conference stronger, help move us toward accomplishing our mission and goals. I am blessed to be among you. Thank you for all you do and may consider doing in the future. # Gaining Strength: The Tie that Binds



And though one might prevail against another, two will withstand one. A threefold cord is not quickly broken. (Ecclesiastes 4:12)

Autumn blessings to you all! We find ourselves in November 2021, on the cusp of change. The pandemic is still upon us, but vaccines work and masks are making a difference. Advent is almost here, but we're uncertain what the new year will bring. Where do we go from here? In my prayers for us concerning this time, two scripture passages come to mins. The first is the one above, from the Old Testament. Many of us recall this biblical image, because

it is used often at weddings, where "a threefold cord" is actually wound together into a stronger bond, symbolizing how God and the marrying couple are bound together in fidelity, faith and love.

But look closer at the full verse. It starts not with peace and harmony, but with conflict: two are divided, fighting to "prevail against" the other. Then straight away, a different path is taken: "two will withstand one." It doesn't say, "two will team up to overcome one." This is not bullying or ganging up, in other words. It's "standing with" – united against forces that may seek to drive them apart. This is taken even further in the second line, where two-against-one transforms into three, joining forces. Could it be, that the two have not destroyed or driven away their enemy – but have instead, drawn the other into a loving embrace? So that the three become something new: an unbreakable one.

This is both the will of our God, as well as the essence of God's very being. The Holy Trinity. One in Three and Three in One. Mysterious in so many ways, our Triune God also comes "down to earth" for us, in these days when so many forces and factions try to drive us apart. Jesus, the One who came down to us, reveals to us the truth of the threefold cord – through his life, death, and resurrection, connecting our reality to his. And he spoke of this connection in very everyday terms, in this second Bible verse:

[Jesus said:] "Again, truly I tell you, if two of you agree on earth about anything you ask, it will be done for you by my Father in heaven. For where two or three are gathered in my name, I am there among them." (Matthew 18:19–20)

This practical promise lies behind the work we are doing, as a Synod, to reach God's three "Vital-Sign Goals", over the next five years. "GROWING YOUNG" is the goal to bring faithful young people and "young at heart" of all ages together, as Jesus-centered community, empowered and led by the Spirit to change the world. "GOING BEYOND DEATH TO LIFE" is the goal to bring together congregations to understand and live out their God-given purpose, at all points in their congregational life cycle, from birth to death and beyond, leaving a faithful, lasting legacy.

But the Vital Sign Goal that most comes to my mind at this moment, with these two verses, is the Goal we call "GAINING STRENGTH." Over the next year especially, we have a unique opportunity to explore and shore up the strengths we have, as individuals, and congregations, and as synod. And the best way to build up strength is to share and combine those strengths, for our common good, the good of our neighbors, and most of all, because God has made us for life together, and work together.

We are the threefold cord. We are called to gather as twos and threes, in the name of Christ, and ask God to overcome our divisions, combine our strengths, and send us out to be Christ for the sake of all: healing the hurt, loving the land, and engaging the stranger. Blest be the tie that binds / our hearts in Christian love;

The unity of heart and mind / is like to that above. (ELW 656)
