Bonnie's Letter

Dear Friends.

Whew! The Spring Conference Meeting for 2022 is a wrap! I wanted to share some reflections with you from the meeting and concerns as well.

We utilized the Golden Rule as our theme and Valarie Kaur, our keynote speaker, author of **See No Stranger**, and creator of the Revolutionary Love Project, challenged us to love our neighbor as THEY wish to be loved, rather than as we want to be loved. She mentioned that may be subversive, but I think it is truly what Jesus was calling us to do when he commanded us to **Love Our Neighbor**. Her presentation was very well received and will be available on the PNEC website sometimes in the future.

The Interfaith Worship Service went well, even without our Muslim presenter, Imam Daniel Hernandez, whose father's emergency surgery prevented him from being with us. Likewise, our educational presentations from the morning went well and I think we learned a lot. Remember that if you want credit for Cultural Competency Education you need to complete, sign, and submit your meeting evaluation.

The business meeting went well. New nominees to the Conference Board, Conference Committees and General Synod Delegates were elected. Thank you to the tellers, especially Martin Nuscher for running results back and forth throughout the room. We thanked our departing members of committees and the board and installed those newly elected. Reports were affirmed and accepted and recognitions for OCWM, Five for Five, Pastoral Anniversaries, and New Pastors were offered.

We closed with a brief communion service and the meeting concluded right on time.

Now for my concern – or maybe concerns. One-hundred twenty-five (125) individuals registered and attended the meting either in person or virtually. Firstly, with 129 churches, each entitled to a delegate, and two hundred pastors, each entitled to a vote, the turnout was abysmal. I understand we met in May rather than April. I understand there were costs for room and meals, less for commuters and more for those staying. And yet, where did the apathy and neglect of our wider church covenantal responsibility come from? Secondly, it did not go unnoticed how many authorized ministers left before the closing worship service, a service that lasted a mere 25 minutes, included communion and was a culmination of our meeting. Was 25 minutes to attend worship a significant difference in our time commitments?

Those concerns are shared as questions, because I, and I am sure the Conference Meeting Planning Committee, would like to have answers. Please share them with us.

I want to take one more opportunity to thank our Tech Team – Anthony Newett (our technical advisor par excellence and musician), Doug Lander (creator of slides), Joanne Marchetto (who set up the polls, webinar, and zoom meeting), Becky Sausser (who monitored virtual participants for questions and responses), and Robert Gutekunst (tech support, worship planner and musician). The Conference Meeting Planning Team, chaired by Joanne Marchetto for the past two years, did excellent work and I comment them and Joanne.

Perhaps more of you will be with us at the Fall Meeting on Saturday, November 5 from 9 – 4 pm at Forks United Church of Christ in Stockertown. I hope so. - Blessings, Bonnie

SYNOD NEWS

NORTHEASTERN PENNSYLVANIA SYNOD, ELCA



"When you pass through the waters, I will be with you; and through the rivers, they shall not overwhelm you..." [Isaiah 43:2] This is the promise God made to the people of Israel, in a time when the whole nation was suffering the consequences of their turning away from their primary mission: to love God and love neighbor - especially, neighbors with the least advantages, status and resources. For our time, our church, and our synod, one of our most troubling issues is the sin of racism. Isaiah goes on to say: "Bring forth the people who are blind, yet have eyes, who are deaf, yet have ears!" [Is. 43:8] This speaks to the first step to take into those troubled waters: opening our eyes and ears to see and listen - with minds and hearts willing to go beneath the smooth surface and stir up the stories and truths that, though troubling, will clear the way for God "to do a new thing; now it springs forth, do you not perceive it? I will make a way in the wilderness and rivers in the desert." [Is. 43:19] + Bishop Christopher deForest

On May 22, 2021, the Northeastern Pennsylvania Synod hosted a virtual conference called "Trouble the Water," an inaugural day of racial justice worship and workshops. The goal of this event was to help our congregations to be more welcoming to Black, indigenous, and people of color; and to focus on racial justice and reconciliation within our churches, communities, and synod.

Participants were welcomed with a brief introduction to what we hoped to accomplish, and a request for participants to join us in that troubled water – to be willing to experience the discomfort caused by the ripples, and to plan to ride the waves of change and progress that we hoped to create. The organizers started with a land acknowledgment, acknowledged our shared national history of racism and discrimination, and explained that such historical acknowledgment was not about blaming us as individuals today, but about understanding how we came to be where we are in order to understand how to move forward together.

Next, we all worshiped together with song, prayer, and a sermon by Rev. Dr. James Thomas on "The Sins of Racism." Following worship, The Reverend CeCee Mills delivered an incredibly powerful keynote address, and after that two sets of concurrent workshops were offered. The first set of workshop options included Understanding Microaggressions, Trauma-Informed Neighborhood Engagement, Understanding Implicit Bias, and a presentation on the community organizing group POWER Northeast. The second set of workshops included Seeing and Disrupting Racism; Understanding White Privilege; and Church Together (led by ELCA Director of Racial Justice Jennifer De Leon).

The "Trouble the Water" event provided important space for honest, difficult conversation: wrestling with systemic racism and naming our complicity in a broken, inequitable system. Your gifts cultivate a Synod culture that listens to the stories of all people and actively works towards reflecting the Kingdom of God. Our ELCA has a mission of encountering 1 million new, young, and diverse people with the Good News in Jesus Christ. Thank you for your faithful, generous, and consistent giving to Mission Support.
