


PEW COMMUNION IS BACK!

Call to Order. Pastor's Report: report reviewed and accepted. It has been suggested that we return to alternating pew/altar communion. We will start this in August and see how it goes. Treasurer's Report: Presented and Reviewed. Motion to accept: Dan. 2nd Blair

Committee Reports: (Board Representative in parentheses) Worship and Music(Rick Zelinski)-nothing new to report

Property(Scot Dietrich)-Darryl Fritz states the permit application has been signed for the water treatment and we now just have to wait to get the permit before the work can be done. The equipment has been ordered. The last 2 water tests were normal. We do have a few quotes for the work on the parking lot and they will be reviewed with Amanda before final decisions are made. They will be looking at the lights in the Sunday school room to complete the upgrades before September when the new school year starts. The boilers have been serviced by Jay Hollenbach. The drain was cleaned from the AC in the Auditorium due to a leak. The rest will also need to be done.

Finance(Gary Clemson)- The last payment to Countryside was made in May and we will have a credit to be used for the fall. NO new contracts will be looked into until after this is used up. We will need to have a second name added to the checking account and it will be decided who it will be in the near future.

There was a Benevolence check given to Make -A-Wish last year that was returned for \$687.50. A discussion was held regarding where the money should be given. A motion was made by Gary to send the money to the Tamagua Adult Daycare and was seconded by Sam and Blair. All were in favor.

CE/Sunday School(Rick Zelinski)-nothing new

Youth Group(Dan Metzger)-They will be going to Knoebels on Monday July 17th and their next meeting will be in September.

Outreach/Evangelism/Fundraising(Amanda and Nancy)- They are continuing to plan for the Chili cook-off and Talent show. There will also be another Pizza Sale in September. They will be going to the Adult Daycare on Friday, August 11th for a picnic. The remainder of the scarves for the Christmas outreach will be made on August 5th. There will be a meeting on August 15th at the Sextons house for the outreach committee. Fundraising needs help for the Old Fashioned Social on July 30th. The two committees will be working on the Trunk or Treat for October.

Personnel(Amanda Sassaman)- The Board members will be continuing to count the money after church. Amy will be available at the church for 12 hours a week. It will be encouraged for those needing assistance to call ahead to make sure someone is here as she will be leaving when the work is done.

Safety/Security(Blair Miller)-There was a meeting held earlier in the week. The MEDIVAC landing site was reviewed. This will be determined by the Fire Company after we would call 911 depending on the concern. A trauma kit was purchased for the Narthex and another one is being ordered for upstairs. 3M security film was discussed to be placed on the windows of the doors in the Narthex as well as on the Auditorium windows. Possible types were reviewed and a motion to order the 12mil film for approximately \$620 was made by Dan and seconded by Gary. All were in favor. The security team will be introduced to the congregation so they know who to look to in the possibility of an event for instructions. We are looking into training for CPR/first aid.

A Letter from the Rev. Dr. Bonnie Bates, Conference Minister

LABOR DAY -WHY DO WE CELEBRATE IT?

(Labor Day celebrates the women and men who campaigned tirelessly for workers' rights in the labor movement of the late 19th century. Their hard-fought wins are the reason for many of the rights we enjoy and take for granted today, such as a 40-hour work week, safe work conditions, paid time off, and sick leave. Those workers saw that there could be no freedom and liberty in this country without economic freedom for the working class. The holiday honors the source of this nation's strength—American workers, unions, and labor leaders. No matter how you decide to celebrate Labor Day 2023, take some time to reflect and pay tribute to all the laborers, past and present, who helped build America and make it the country it is today...)

Labor Day became a U.S. federal holiday in 1894, but by that time thirty states already officially celebrated the holiday.

Labor Day was created by members of the labor movement, who organized strikes and rallies to fight for better working conditions amid the Industrial Revolution, according to the History Channel.

On September 5, 1882, New York City union leaders organized what is now considered the country's first Labor Day parade, according to <u>National Geographic</u>.

On this day, 10,000 workers took unpaid time off to march through the streets of New York City, in an event culminating in a picnic, fireworks, and dancing. Organizers declared the day "a general holiday for the workingmen of this city." Their idea spread across the country, and many states passed legislation recognizing the workers' holiday.

It wasn't until 1894, however, that Congress legalized the holiday following the Pullman strike, a nationwide railroad boycott that turned fatal and shined a national spotlight on workers' rights. Amid this massive unrest, Congress sought to make peace with American workers by passing an act making Labor Day a legal holiday. President Grover Cleveland officially signed it into law on June 28, 1894. Strangely enough, The Department of Labor was created *after* Labor Day became a holiday, and it was the first department to be led by a woman: Francis Perkins.



RACIAL JUSTICE TRAINING FOR ROSTERED LEADERS

As per "Resolution: Anti-Racism Education Emphasis" submitted to the 2022 Synod Assembly and passed at the July 2022 meeting of the Synod Council, all NEPA Synod rostered leaders (pastors and deacons) and synodically authorized lay leaders are required to have Anti-Racism Training at least every 3 years, at the same cost as Boundary Training. To help meet this requirement, the Synod Racial Justice Team has scheduled two training events for Fall 2023, for those who were not able to attend one of the Winter 2023 sessions. **Lay Leaders are also welcome to attend.**

The eHarmony of Prison Reentry STORYTELLING ENGAGEMENT

As you read this story, what questions arise?

How might you share this story with others in your ministry setting?

A story from our Grand Canyon Synod

Over 600,000 people are released from prison every year, and as they struggle to rejoin society, they face barriers to connecting with reentry service providers. We are honored that so many of our synods and congregations are active in prison ministry; yet they know the challenge of finding reliable and effective resources to support folks once they've been released.

Our synods are supporting reentry ministry: the Metropolitan Chicago Synod helped start the work and the Grand Canyon Synod has launched the innovative online resource the <u>Inside Out Network (ION)</u>, a one-of-a-kind platform that helps returning citizens connect with the support they need for a successful reentry. The Grand Canyon Synod has made a strong commitment, awarding ION an "Adapting, Connecting, Transforming and Sustaining" grant so it can help people access ministries and service providers.

ION is a bit like eHarmony: returning citizens and service providers can find each other and exchange messages, even before release, to make sure returning citizens get the support they need as soon after release as possible. What started as a prison ministry from an ELCA church in the Chicago area is now operating in Illinois and Arizona and launching soon in Oregon, with 6,400 returning citizens and 443 service providers and ministries enrolled. ION is always free to returning citizens, and service providers participate free of charge for a year before paying a modest annual fee.

With the lifting of COVID-19 restrictions, ION has gone into Arizona prisons to train staff on using the platform. This has led to inmates enrolling before their release; reports indicate that as release approaches, they are less anxious, seeing ahead of time what help will be available.

ION values its partnerships with ministry and is currently developing a Reentry Congregational Initiative, gathering insights from faith communities that intentionally minister to returning citizens. Many ELCA congregations work in this area, and we welcome any insights they might provide by completing this <u>survey</u>. (https://www.surveymonkey.com/r/SLFWMLS). ION intends to develop a guidebook called "Effective Reentry Ministry for Ordinary Congregations"; its valuable "Spiritual Survival Guide for Prison and Beyond" can be read or downloaded free of charge from the ION website at <u>insideoutnetwork.net/resources</u>.
