Bonnie's Letter

"Immediately he (Jesus) made his disciples get into the boat and go on ahead to the other side, to Bethsaida, while he dismissed the crowd. After saying farewell to them, he went up on the mountain to pray." Mark 6:45-46 NRSVUE

Dear Friends,

I must admit to you that I am tired: physically, emotionally, and spiritually tired. Some of the tiredness is traversing the chaos that is in our nation and the world. Some of the tiredness is from traveling and meeting with some intensity about middle judicatory staff (like me) and how we can be more effective. Some of the tiredness is in my spirit – my spirit which sings and reads and preaches and listens for the voice of God. It is possible sometimes for the voice of God to get pushed aside, overcome by the busyness of life and the ongoing cacophony of voices pulling me in multiple directions.

How about you? Is there tiredness in your body, your mind, and/or your spirit?

Take a moment right now and breathe! No, I mean it. Take a moment while you are reading this letter and breathe!

Sometimes we can get so distracted by the "To-Do" list, by those calling out to us for help, by our own chores and environment that we forget to breathe. I am reminded often, as I look at my Smart Watch that my stress level is moderate to high. I knew it before I looked but the watch confirms my need to breathe, to pause, to pray, to reflect. A friend publishes a Facebook prayer every morning. I wait for the wisdom that is shared by religious leaders in those posts. I have another Facebook friend who publishes what she calls "shoot and share" pictures and quotations every day. I love the pictures and the quotes and sometimes I sink into my chair and just see myself at the lake, in the mountains, in the garden, anywhere the phone isn't chiming and the door bell isn't ringing and the computer isn't reminding me of the hundreds of email messages to be answered and the work waiting for me.

Even Jesus took time away to pray, my friends. Even Jesus, in his divinity and humanness, took the quiet time to speak to God, to rest in nature, to sleep and to be renewed. We are surely not Jesus, but that divinity and humanity is in all of us. We, too, need moments of rest and renewal. So, take a moment right now and breathe! I mean it, breathe! Ease into a comfortable position and share your deepest need and your deepest challenge with God. Do it now. Not later when you think you have time, but right now. Ease into God's embrace. Calm your mind. Rest your body. Engage your spirit and just BE – for you are a human being and simply "being" is a part of our role in the world. You are BE-loved. May it be so.

"I'm always struck by the simple but profound technologies that camp employs to build healthy, loving, Christ-centered community: silly songs and deep conversations, skits and games, shared meals and rituals." These words from Pastor Inge Williams of Friedens Lutheran in Shartlesville, a 2025 summer chaplain at Bear Creek Camp, reflect the deep joy and quiet transformation that unfold in the woods each season.

All Together was the theme this summer, focusing on growing stronger through love and service, grace-filled faith, and belonging and community. Pastor Inge witnessed this connection firsthand early in the summer



when she served as one of the camp chaplains during Family Camp. Pastor Inge shared, "On one of the first nights, I saw one of the former youth Synod Council representatives, now serving as a counselor this summer, give a high five to a toddler from Ireland who was running all over the field during a kickball game. The kindness and connection across ages, and even international borders, really exemplified what Family Camp is about."

While chapel time and worship services are typically led by the young adult summer staff, camp chaplains provide spiritual support throughout the week, leading devotions and Bible studies for campers and staff. They offer encouragement, listening ears, and join in the fun that camp has to offer. Throughout the summer, three Northeastern PA Synod pastors brought their time, energy, and Spirit-led presence to Bear Creek Camp as chaplains. Pastor Inge Williams and Pastor Jennifer Heavner of Star of Bethlehem Lutheran Church served during Family Camp, while Pastor Liz Koerner of St. John Lutheran in Stroudsburg closed out the season as chaplain during the final week.

The partnership with Bear Creek Camp, shared with the Southeastern PA Synod, is especially meaningful to our synod, as the values of camp and synod closely align. Both are deeply committed to building relationships and belonging across congregations, generations, and diverse communities. As synod, we continue to search for ways to raise leaders who serve with compassion, creativity, and courage in the church and the world, which is why our partnership with Bear Creek Camp is so important. It is prioritizing youth and allowing them space to search for ways to serve others as a natural response to God's love.

Serving others was the theme of one of Pastor Liz's Bible studies during her week as chaplain. When she met with the Junior campers (grades 2–4), she asked how they might take the ways they serve others at camp and apply them at home and in their school communities. Helping others at camp can seem second nature, especially after a full week of being together. However, campers are not only learning how to be kind to one another. They are learning life skills that will stay with them long after the week ends.

Throughout the week, they are learning how to be confident and independent through overnight tent camping experiences. They are learning about teamwork and communication as they encourage each other on high rope activities. They grow spiritually through the guidance of our chaplains, who are a daily presence within the camp schedule and help shape campers' understanding of faith and their connection to God.

We are extremely grateful for the passion and dedication of Pastor Inge, Pastor Jennifer, and Pastor Liz, who devoted their time this past summer,



and for the ongoing work of Bear Creek Camp as it builds inclusive community, nurtures faith, and develops leaders who carry their experiences into the world with empathy, joy, and purpose. This certainly could not be accomplished without the hardworking, compassionate summer staff and the leadership of Executive Director Collin Grooms, Program Director Kallie Handlong, and all the other camp leaders who contribute and put youth first.

Camp doesn't end when the summer does. In addition to summer camp, Bear Creek Camp offers retreats and camps outside of the summer timeframe including the upcoming Labor Day Family Camp, Fall Women's Retreat, and Winter Camp.
